Key Weekly Objectives

Each week we will highlight key objectives covered in seventh grade during the week.

Literature:

To practice vocabulary, comprehension, interpretation, literary connection, artistic representation, close reading over the course of a fictional text through literature circle

Religion:

Math: To find the least common multiple; To write rational numbers as decimals To write terminating and repeating decimals as fractions

Science: To identify some ways humans use the natural resource of water

Language Arts: I can add descriptive details to my characters and setting. I can spell possessive nouns correctly.

History: I can describe the characteristics that made Roman Emperors successful or terrible.

Literature Circle: This week we are starting literature circles.. The genre we are exploring for this session is dystopian literature. They will meet with their literature circle group on Tuesdays and Fridays. (Except for the last week before Christmas break when the last meeting will be on Thursday, December 19th) Every student is responsible for the assigned reading and his or her job assignment for each literature circle meeting group. No late assignments will be accepted for these assignments because they are letting their group down if they are not doing their part. The only exception to this is an absence, and then the assignment is due upon the student's return.

Literature circles do NOT take the place of independent reading. Students still need to be reading an independent reading book during SSR, and each week's reader's notebook is based on the independent reading not the literature circle book.
